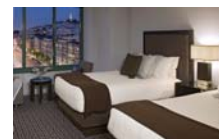
EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

- ◆ List current therapeutic information on immunomodulators used in rheumatoid arthritis with the goal of constructing a patient-tailored treatment plan
- ◆ Integrate the information on the physiological regulation of androgen production and drug targeting for the hormonal therapy in prostate cancer
- ◆ Evaluate how The Joint Commission Safety goals in anticoagulation and Surgical Care Improvement Project have impacted the use of anticoagulants
- ◆ Critically discuss how pharmacy practice law affects a pharmacist's handling of controlled substances used for pain management
- ◆ Formulate appropriate treatment regimens for a variety of pain syndromes
- ◆ Utilize knowledge of mechanism of action and side effects for the proper monitoring of drugs used to treat pulmonary artery hypertension
- ◆ Compare and contrast the value and clinical risk of various drugs used to manage the patient experiencing an acute episode of sepsis
- ◆ Place newer types of drugs for type 2 diabetes in their proper location in a therapeutic algorithm
- ◆ Use a logical diagnostic approach that results in various treatment options for the different clinical components of dementia
- ◆ Gain insight into the newer drugs for macular degeneration and their varying ability to restore vision
- ◆ Be able to properly guide and counsel a patient on the proper selection, benefits and use of natural and alternative medicines
- ◆ Examine the evidence based treatment of PTSD and to compare this to the actual practice of PTSD treatment
- ◆ Formulate a plan to detect potential abuse of prescription medications during routine pharmacy encounters
- ◆ Evaluate the various approaches and drug selection strategies for managing patients with HIV infection
